SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

The applicant must be a current senior student in good standing at Cuyahoga Falls High School.

The applicant must be planning enrollment in a 2 or 4 year accredited college or university degree program, or, for certain scholarships, a trade or technical school.

Each applicant must complete the **two-page application** and also submit an **essay** (not to exceed one page) describing his/her background, accomplishments, future goals and how the Cuyahoga Falls Schools have prepared him/her for the future.

Please **read each scholarship's description** and **apply *only*** for those for which you qualify.

The applicant **should further note each scholarship's additional specific requirements, such as grade point average, field of study limitations, or financial needs documentation.** Your FAFSA report should be included in your collated packet if you are applying for a scholarship with financial need as a specific requirement.

The applicant must **submit the following items (and only these items)**:

- Checklist (page 5) of scholarships for which you are applying**
- Photograph**
- Application (page 3)**
- One page essay**
- FAFSA form if applicable**
Be sure FAFSA form has EFC (Estimated Family Contribution) number.
- Senior Activity Sheet (page 4)**
- Any other requirements specific to a scholarship for which you have applied**

SUBMIT ONLY THE INFORMATION REQUESTED BY THE CUYAHOGA FALLS SCHOOLS FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP COMMITTEE (do not include, for example, letters of recommendation, college letters of acceptance, resumes, etc.). SUBMIT ONLY THE FAFSA PAGE THAT SHOWS YOUR EFC (Estimated Family Contribution) NUMBER.

Submit to the Cuyahoga Falls High School Guidance office by the **February 28, 2017** deadline.

Collate packets in this order: checklist of scholarships, photo, application, essay, FAFSA (if applicable), Senior Activity Sheet and other information if applicable.

A selection recommendation will be made by a committee appointed by the Cuyahoga Falls Schools Alumni Foundation Board of Trustees and, subsequently, affirmed by that Board.

THE BOB MAXWELL MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

(A one year scholarship)

Established in 2002
First granted in 2003

The Bob Maxwell Memorial Scholarship consists of \$1000.00 to be paid in two installments of \$500.00 each at the beginning of the first two semesters/quarters upon written verification of enrollment in a college or university.

This scholarship was established by family members and friends to honor the memory of Bob Maxwell, Cuyahoga Falls High School Class of 1975. Bob was an All-State quarterback for the Black Tigers; his dedication and support of the Black & Gold is unparalleled. Bob's spirit and memory will live on forever.

Specific requirements:

1. Applicant must have a grade point average of 2.7 or higher.
2. Applicant must display financial need.
3. Applicant must have lettered in at least one (1) varsity sport.

THE BOB AND BARB SCHRAY MOST INSPIRATIONAL STUDENT AWARD

(A one year scholarship)

This scholarship will be awarded to an outstanding student at Cuyahoga Falls High School. It will provide \$1,000 paid in two installments of \$500 during the first year of college to the selected recipient upon written verification of enrollment in a university or college.

This scholarship is made possible through the generosity of the Class of 1955 who want to honor their classmates, Bob and Barbara McLean Schray. Bob had been recognized as a top athlete. After being stricken with polio in ninth grade, his active athletic career was ended, yet he managed CFHS teams and coached youth sports. He was Student Council President and Class Treasurer. Barb was Class Vice-President. They were king and queen of the senior prom. After two years at Kent State, they married and completed their undergraduate degrees at Ohio State University. Barb became a teacher; Bob became a pharmacist after completing graduate work at Ohio Northern. They adopted two infant boys and took legal custody of Bob's 15 year old brother and 9 year old sister after Bob's father was killed in an accident. Bob pilots a private plane, snowmobiles, kayaks, and has spent five years working with a pit crew for an auto racing team. Now retired, Bob and Barb are active with their church and have volunteered for many church missions to foreign countries.

Specific requirements:

1. Applicant must have overcome a personal hardship.
2. Applicant should have a 3.0 grade point average or better.
3. Applicant should display leadership in extra-curricular activities (athletics, music, drama, class officer, club, church, or community).
4. At the time of the selection committee review, the applicant must not have received any other scholarships.
5. The applicant must submit a 300 word essay describing the hardship and how it has been overcome.

THE CAROL (INCH) MEALY & ROBIN (MEALY) SULLIVAN MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

(A one year scholarship)

Established in 2012 by Robert Mealy

First granted in 2013

The Carol (Inch) Mealy & Robin (Mealy) Sullivan Memorial Scholarship consists of \$1000.00 to be paid in two installments of \$500.00 each at the beginning of the first two semester/quarters upon written verification of enrollment in a college or university.

This scholarship is established to honor the memory of Carol (Inch) Mealy & Robin (Mealy) Sullivan. Carol (Inch) Mealy graduated from Cuyahoga Falls High School in June, 1957. Robin (Mealy) Sullivan graduated from CFHS in 1977. Robin earned her Bachelor's Degree in music from Kent State University in 1981. She received a Master's Degree (Woodwind Instruments) from the University of Michigan in 1983.

Specific requirements:

1. Applicant must have a grade point average of 3.25 and above.
2. Preference given to a music major (an instrumental music major will get first consideration).

THE CHARLENE CULP MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

(A one year scholarship)

Established October 4, 1990

First granted in 1991

The Charlene Culp Memorial Scholarship will consist of \$1500.00 paid in two installments of \$750.00 upon written verification of enrollment in a university or college.

This scholarship has been established by Mrs. William F. Culp and family to assist Cuyahoga Falls High School seniors in their subsequent college/university freshmen year and is in memory of Charlene Elizabeth Culp, Class of 1967.

Specific requirements:

1. Applicant must have a grade point average of 3.0 or better.
2. Applicant must be enrolling in any two (2) or four (4) year college or university degree program.

THE CHARLES D. PETTY MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

(A one year scholarship)

Established in 2012

The Charles D. Petty Memorial Scholarship will be awarded to an accounting student with financial need. This scholarship of \$1000.00 is to be paid in two installments of \$500.00 each at the beginning of the first two semesters/quarters upon written verification of enrollment in a college or university

This scholarship has been established by the family of Dale Petty CPA in honor of his father Charles D. Petty, Class of 1945. The purpose is to honor Charles Petty by recognizing and encouraging performance in the area of accounting. Charles D. Petty was a graduate of Kent State University, a certified public accountant, and a lifelong member of the First Methodist Church.

Specific requirements:

1. Applicant must have financial need.
2. Scholarship will be given to a student planning to major in accounting.

THE CLARA GROHE MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

(A one year scholarship)

Established in 1997
First granted in 1998

The Clara Grohe Memorial Scholarship will be awarded to an outstanding female athlete. This scholarship of \$1000.00 is to be paid in two installments of \$500.00 each at the beginning of the first two semesters/quarters upon written verification of enrollment in a college or university.

This scholarship has been established by the late Miss Clara Grohe, Class of January 1944, to recognize and encourage performance in the area of women's athletics.

Specific requirements:

1. Applicant must have performed on a women's varsity athletic team during high school.
2. Applicant must have evidence of a good scholastic record.
3. Financial need is important but is not a primary consideration.

THE CLINTON B. EMMERICH & MARY GAIL MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

(A one year scholarship)

Established in 1998
First granted in 1998

The Clinton B. Emmerich Memorial Scholarship consists of \$1000.00 to be paid in two installments of \$500.00 each at the beginning of the first two semesters/quarters upon written verification of enrollment in a college or university.

This scholarship has been established as a lasting remembrance of all the contributions, services and leadership given to Cuyahoga Falls Schools by Clinton B. Emmerich as an English teacher (8 years), principal of Sill School (10 years) and Assistant Superintendent of Schools for Personnel and Instruction (16 years) from 1948 to 1980.

Specific requirements:

1. Applicant must have a grade point average between 2.5 and 3.25.
2. At the time of the interview, the applicant must not have received any other scholarships.

THE CRABTREE – TURNEY SCHOLARSHIP

(A one year scholarship)

First granted in 1990

The Crabtree–Turney Scholarship consists of \$1000.00 to be paid in two installments of \$500.00 each at the beginning of the first two semesters/quarters upon written verification of enrollment in a college or university.

This scholarship has been established by Dr. Robert Hugh Crabtree as a lasting remembrance of his early schooling and the positive influence he received from Sill Middle School schoolteacher, Miss Virginia Diane Turney.

Specific requirements:

1. Applicant must have previously attended H. A. Preston Elementary School and/or Sill Middle School. If no application is received from any academically qualified students who previously attended H. A. Preston Elementary and/or Sill Middle School, the scholarship will be open to any applicant meeting all the other standards for this scholarship.
2. Any applicant to be enrolled in Northeastern Ohio Universities College of Medicine is excluded from being considered as a recipient of this scholarship.

CUNNINGHAM MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

(A one year scholarship)

Established in 2012
First granted in 2012

The Cunningham Memorial Scholarship consists of \$ 1000.00 to be paid in two installments of \$500.00 each at the beginning of the first two semester/quarters upon written verification of enrollment in a college, university or trade school.

This scholarship is established to honor the memory of Earl and Ruby Cunningham and their only child, Gerald, Cuyahoga Falls High School Class of 1965. Gerry passed away 6 weeks prior to his graduation. The American Flag that had flown over the United States Capital Building on the day of his death was placed on his seat at graduation.

Specific requirements:

1. Applicant must have a grade point average of 2.5 – 3.25.

**THE CUYAHOGA FALLS HIGH SCHOOL
CLASS OF 1951 SCHOLARSHIP**

(A one year scholarship)

Established in 2012

The Cuyahoga Falls High School Class of 1951 Scholarship will consist of \$1000.00 paid in two installments of \$500.00 upon written verification of enrollment in a university or college.

This scholarship was established by the amiable and good-hearted men and women of the Cuyahoga Falls High School Class of 1951.

Specific requirements:

1. Applicant must have a 2.5 to 3.25 GPA.
2. Applicant must have financial need.

**THE CUYAHOGA FALLS HIGH SCHOOL
CLASS OF 1958 SCHOLARSHIP**

(A four year scholarship)

Established in 2007

The Cuyahoga Falls High School Class of 1958 awards two (2) scholarships. Each scholarship consists of an amount not to exceed \$5,000 to be paid in two installments of \$2500.00 each at the beginning of the first two semesters/quarters upon written verification of enrollment in a university, college, or two or four year technical school. The scholarship may be renewed up to a total of three additional years. The applicant must maintain at least a 3.0 GPA to be considered for each additional year of the scholarship. A letter of request for continuation of the scholarship and a copy of grade transcripts must be submitted to the Foundation no later than August 1 each year for consideration of renewal. The selection committee will determine the number of scholarships to be awarded based upon applications.

This scholarship has been established to commemorate the 50th anniversary of the Class of 1958 and is comprised of donations made by members of the class.

Specific requirements:

1. Applicant must have maintained a grade point average of 3.0 or higher.
2. Applicant must have been active in school or community.
3. Applicant must possess a substantial financial need and submit a copy of his/her FAFSA's EFC report.

THE CUYAHOGA FALLS HIGH SCHOOL SWIM TEAM SCHOLARSHIP

(A one year scholarship)

Established in 2010
First granted in 2010

The Black Tiger Swim Team Scholarship consists of \$1,000 to be awarded annually to eligible swim team members. It may all go to one swimmer or to as many as two, depending on the number of eligible candidates. The amount determined for each award will be paid in one payment after proof of enrollment is received.

The scholarship has been established by an anonymous donor with the expectation that it will be funded in the future by swim team supporters.

The purpose of the scholarship is to honor the high school swimmer who has dedicated his/her 4 years of high school to the team. Even though the applicant may not be continuing his/her swimming career, he/she has given up 4 winter breaks to swim twice a day, practiced 2 hours a day, six days a week for 3-4 months, all just for the dedication to the sport. While doing all of this, the applicant has kept up his/her grades.

Specific requirements:

Member of the Cuyahoga Falls men's or women's swim team for 4 years. Does not have to have lettered all 4 years. The swim team coach determines eligibility based on the individual's dedication to the team. Swim team coach recommends candidates to the Foundation Scholarship Committee who will pick the recipient or recipients.

1. Have a 3.0 GPA as determined after the first semester of the senior year
2. Not swimming in college, or if swimming, not receiving a scholarship for swimming
3. Recommendation by the coach as to integrity of the applicant

THE CUYAHOGA FALLS LIONS CLUB SCHOLARSHIP

(A one year scholarship)

First established as Falls Lions Club Scholarship in 1989

This scholarship, established by **The Cuyahoga Falls Lions Club**, will consist of \$1000.00 paid in two installments of \$500.00 each upon written verification of enrollment in a university or college.

Specific requirements:

1. Applicant must grade point average of 3.25 or above.

DALE LAUREN FOLAND SCHOLARSHIP

(a one year scholarship)

First granted in 2016

The Dale Lauren Foland Scholarship consists of \$2500 to be paid in two installments of \$1250 each at the beginning of the first two semester/quarters upon written verification of enrollment in a college, university or trade school.

The scholarship was established to honor Dale Foland, a 2015 Distinguished Alumni Award winner. Mr. Foland graduated from Cuyahoga Falls High School in 1943. He went to Kent State University for one year before joining the Marines during the Korean War, earning a Purple Heart. A few years later Mr. Foland started his own company with \$7000. Today it is multinational company with over 600 employees. A few of his accomplishments are helping to start and fund the Starlight School, MRDD, a technology wing for Kent State University Tuscarawas campus, and the Tuscarawas County Center for the Arts. Mr. Foland believes in education and offers tuition reimbursement for his employees.

Specific requirements:

1. Applicant must have a grade point average of 3.25 and above

THE DAVID LEE WILSON MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

(a one year scholarship)

First granted in 2016

The David Lee Wilson Scholarship shall be awarded annually to a graduating senior from Cuyahoga Falls High School. The scholarship shall be for \$1000.00 to be paid in two installments: half the first semester of attendance and the remaining half the second semester of attendance with the condition of satisfactory completion of the first semester. The scholarship may be used at any fully accredited two or four year institution of higher education or any fully accredited two year institution of higher education or trade school.

The scholarship was established by family members and friends to honor the memory of David Lee Wilson.

Specific Requirements:

1. Applicant must have a grade point average between 2.5 and 3.25

THE DESIREE SCHOLARSHIP

(A one year scholarship)

First granted in 2008

The Desiree Scholarship consists of \$1000 paid to a student furthering his/her education to work with physically or mentally challenged children (infant to preschool).

This scholarship was established by the Hillman family in loving memory of their first granddaughter, Desiree.

Specific requirements:

1. Applicant must have a 2.5 to 3.5 GPA.
2. Applicant must submit a 75 word statement about what he/she feels is most important when working with children with these challenges.
3. Teacher and/or counselor recommendation will be required.

THE EGLENA EARLINE LONG MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

(A four year scholarship)

Two scholarships will be given out in her memory every year.

First granted in 2015

The **Eglena Earline Long Memorial Scholarship** consists of \$2500.00 paid in two installments of \$1250.00 at the beginning of each of the two semesters/quarters upon written verification of enrollment in a university or college. The scholarship is renewable for three additional years at \$2500.00 per year (paid in the same manner as the first year) upon presentation of evidence of good academic and full time standing.

Specific requirements:

1. Applicant must have maintained a grade point average of 3.25 or higher.
2. Applicant must possess a substantial financial need and submit a copy of his/her FAFSA's EFC report.

THE EMMA C. HOLMES MILITARY MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

(A two-year scholarship)

First granted in 2015

This \$3,000.00 scholarship will be given in increments of \$1,500.00 per year for two years with payments of \$750.00 per semester as long as the student is in good academic standing. This scholarship will be awarded annually to a Cuyahoga Falls High School student who will pursue a post-secondary program.

Emma was orphaned at a young age, and even though she was in a wheelchair by her early twenties, she spent her entire life as a Marine. She served as liaison between WWI and WWII Marines. In 2013 at the age of 93, Emma received the Colonel Julia E. Hamblet Award. This award is given to an individual who has “done the most to further the recognition of the history of women who have earned the title Marine.” Emma believed that one got out of life what one put into it, and she never gave in to adversity.

Specific requirements:

1. Applicant must be pursuing a post-secondary program.
2. Applicant must have a grade point average of 3.0 in his/her senior year.

**THE CLARA FABER FOUNDATION
\$4,000 FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP**

IN HONOR OF CLARA FABER

(A four year scholarship)

This scholarship will be given in increments of \$1,000 per year; it is renewable for three years as long as the student is in good academic standing. This scholarship will be awarded annually to a Cuyahoga Falls High School student who will pursue a post-secondary program.

Specific requirements:

1. Applicant must be pursuing a post-secondary program.
2. Applicant must have a grade point average of 3.0 in his/her senior year.
3. Applicant must display financial need.

**THE CLARA FABER FOUNDATION
\$4,000 FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP**

IN HONOR OF JACOB FABER

(A four year scholarship)

This scholarship will be given in increments of \$1,000 per year; it is renewable for three years as long as the student is in good academic standing. This scholarship will be awarded annually to a student who completed the Six District Auto Body or Automotive Technology curriculum and will pursue a post-secondary automotive tech or collision program.

Specific requirements:

1. Applicant must be pursuing a post-secondary automotive tech or collision program.
2. Applicant must have a grade point average of 2.5 in his/her senior year.
3. Applicant must display financial need.

**THE CLARA FABER FOUNDATION
\$4,000 FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP
IN HONOR OF JEAN BARBER**

(A four year scholarship)

This scholarship will be given in increments of \$1,000 per year; it is renewable for three years as long as the student is in good academic standing. This scholarship will be awarded annually to a Cuyahoga Falls High School student who will pursue a post-secondary program and has dedicated sizable time and effort in helping the less fortunate.

Specific requirements:

1. Applicant must be pursuing a post-secondary program.
2. Applicant must have a grade point average of 3.0 in his/her senior year.
3. Applicant must display financial need.
4. Applicant must have dedicated sizable time and effort in helping the less fortunate.

**THE CLARA FABER FOUNDATION
\$4,000 FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP**

IN HONOR OF NAN KLINGER AND CHARLES BOYD

(A four year scholarship)

This scholarship will be given in increments of \$1,000 per year; it is renewable for three years as long as the student is in good academic standing. This scholarship will be awarded annually to a Cuyahoga Falls High School student who will pursue a post-secondary program in the performing arts.

Specific requirements:

1. Applicant must be pursuing a degree in the performing arts.
2. Applicant must have a grade point average of 3.0 in his/her senior year.
3. Applicant must display financial need.

**THE CLARA FABER FOUNDATION
\$4,000 FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP**

IN HONOR OF NINA WOLCOTT

(A four year scholarship)

This scholarship will be awarded annually to a student who will pursue a post- secondary program in the field of education. This scholarship will be given in increments of \$1,000 per year; it is renewable for three years as long as the student is in good academic standing. This scholarship will be awarded annually to a Cuyahoga Falls High School student who will pursue a post-secondary program.

Specific requirements:

1. Applicant must be pursuing a degree in education.
2. Applicant must have a grade point average of 3.0 in his/her senior year.
